## The Mountain Pact Thanks Secretary Haaland for Visiting the Potential Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni Grand Canyon National Monument

DURANGO, CO - In response to Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland and Representative Raúl Grijalva holding a community meeting to hear from Tribal leaders, elected officials, and community members about their vision for management of public lands in the greater Grand Canyon landscape, <a href="Mountain Pact">The</a> Mountain Pact, an organization that works with local elected officials in nearly 100 communities across the Western U.S., released the below statement:
